RE Reflections

I have been thinking about how to create a safe space where our middle schoolers can congregate, bond and have fun. It is already challenging to find a curriculum that keeps our older children engaged, particularly since it also has to meet the needs of kids aged 5 to 10. So, I have been having conversations around forming a youth group that will run parallel to our current program and meet the needs of those from grades 6 to 9 (11 to15 years). I have begun to look outside our walls to ensure that we have critical mass to form such a group. I have spoken to other liberal religious organizations about their needs. Between SKUUC, Eden UCC and Congregation Shir Ami, we may have enough of a youth base to get a group off the ground. I see this as the first step in building a program to meet the needs of local liberal religious youth.

I will hold a visioning workshop to gather input on the desires and needs of youth and their parents. If it is successful, and we can get buy-in from the various stakeholders, we can proceed to the next step in the planning process. Notes from the Search: What to Expect During Candidating Week

The excitement is building as we get ready for candidating week: May 7 to 15, 2016.

PLEASE MARK YOUR CALENDARS NOW TO COME TO THE SERVICE ON SUNDAY MAY 15 TO VOTE ON WHETHER TO CALL THE CANDIDATE!!

Candidating week is an exciting time to be at Starr King. The goal is for everyone who is part of the Starr King family to have a chance to meet with our candidate and assess, for yourself, whether this is someone you can see helping us lead our congregation with wisdom, passion, and inspiration in the years to come.

The Search Committee had an amazing experience in meeting the candidate. They were completely unanimous in being blown away with the love, intelligence, insight, and engagement they felt from every pore of our candidate's being. Agnostics, atheists, humanists, theists, and everyone else on the Search Committee felt that finding this person was "meant to be." They hope all of us will take advantage of time with the candidate the second week in May to have our own experience.

We'll start with our candidate's arrival on Saturday, May 7. The candidate will preach on both Sundays, May 8 and May 15. After the service on Sunday, May 15, we will vote on whether to call our candidate. We want to get at least a 90% enthusiastic call, but a higher percentage is definitely welcome and encouraged!

Here's how the week in between the sermons will work: the Candidating Week Committee will be scheduling a series of events during a week that you can attend and get to know the candidate. There will be more on that the first week of May.

In addition, Sara (<u>seraymond@gmail.com</u> or 510-213-9278 cell) will be setting up a calendar on which groups or committees can sign up for time with the candidate. It is first-come, first-served. Sign up early to secure the spot you want.

If your group wants to meet with the candidate, we ask that you spend your time together getting to know each other, rather than conducting business. However, that doesn't mean you couldn't talk about your collective vision for the future and see what perspective you get back. That's an excellent way to get to know the candidate!

When not in meetings, the candidate will be looking for housing in the area. As you know, things are expensive here! If you have any leads, please reach out to the Candidating Week Committee or the Search Committee and let us know details. It may seem like jumping the gun to be looking for housing before the vote, but the Search Committee is passionate about their choice and believes we all will be too.

ON MAY 15 WE WANT EVERYONE AT CHURCH FOR THE VOTE!!! We are hoping for a large turn-out from the membership, to make sure everyone has a chance to be a part of this decision that will affect the lives of the congregation for a very long time. You Spoke; We Listened Adult RE Committee

The Adult Religious Education (RE) Committee distributed questionnaires to the Congregation in late February and early March. We were extremely pleased to receive 37 responses, which is a little more than 30 percent of the congregation.

The survey asked several questions:

- What does adult religious education mean to you?
- What topics are of interest to you?
- Would you be willing to present a class, workshop or seminar, if so, on what topic?
- Do you know of someone who would be a good presenter?

We want to take this opportunity to thank you for the information you provided us and to summarize what you told us. Based on your feedback we've started to plan adult RE events for the next 18 months.

What does adult religious education mean to you?

People responded to this question with words/phases such as: personal and spiritual growth; increasing knowledge of how people live out their spirituality; exploring areas for personal growth, looking for "faith in action" and an opportunity to use both "heart and mind" in our sessions together.

What topics are of interest to you?

The largest number of responses centered around learning more about the major religions of the world, including as well as lesser known traditions. The second next highest topic centered around learning more about our own Unitarian Universalist (UU) tradition including knowing more about the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA), famous and infamous UUs, and their personal paths. People wanted to explore the variety of ways in which spirituality is defined, how people live out their own spirituality, and how we can share our skills in the service of being a UU.

It was also clear that people want interactive sessions where they can share experiences and learn in an atmosphere of openness and trust. People would be interested in creative approaches to learning using crafts, music, foods of the culture, and a variety of art forms.

Would you be willing to present a class, workshop or seminar, if so, on what topic? Do you know of someone who would be a good presenter?

We are grateful for your suggestions for people who would be good presenters and the adult RE Committee will be contacting people who said they would like to present a topic or those who have been suggested as good facilitators for a discussion group. We agreed that child-care will be provided, upon request.

What's in the Works?

Spring Quarter 2016: Building Your Own Theology, will be conducted by the Rev. Joy Atkinson in from May 17 to June 21.

Summer 2016 Quarter: There will no offerings during the summer quarter

The Fall/Winter Quarter 2016: Given the interest to learn more about religions of the world, we begin using *The World's Religions*, written by Huston Smith, a religious scholar, to explore this broad topic. The UUA has a Facilitator's Guide, and we anticipate a series of 89 monthly discussions, facilitated by SKUUC members who will be briefed on how to be a session facilitator. Stay tuned for information about the book, costs, format and specific dates/time.

Spring Quarter 2017: We will be exploring the infinite variety of resources provided by the UUA and others to "take a deep dive" into the UU Seven Principles, as well as discussing famous and infamous UUs.

We'd like to call your attention to the adult RE Brochure, which includes all regular offerings. It will be published quarterly. Additional programs will be announced in the Sunday announcement insert and the weekly email announcements.

The group meets monthly on the second Tuesday of the month from 11 am to 12 noon at the church. Please feel free to join us as you are able. Please contact any one of the members with your ideas about programs and /or if you are interested in being a member of the committee.

"Do the Right Thing" – Spike Lee Still Says So: May 20, 6 pm

Friday, May 20 is ARMCA movie night, and we've got a classic movie! It's called *Do the Right Thing*, from producer, director, and actor Spike Lee.

In case you don't recall it, here's the plot: On the hottest day of the year on a street in the Bedford-Stuyvesant section of Brooklyn, everyone's hate and bigotry smolders and builds until it explodes into violence.

Released in 1989, *Do the Right Thing* provoked a lot of conversations. In this *Rolling Stone* review at the time from Peter Travers: "When a black man sends a garbage can crashing through his white employer's plate-glass window during the galvanizing climax of *Do the Right Thing*, all howling hell breaks loose. And maybe not just onscreen. Producer-writer-director-actor Spike Lee thinks that his movie, which culminates in a race riot, might get him wrongly accused in the white press of stirring insurrection. Before Universal put up the \$6.5 million budget, Lee says, Paramount had passed on the project for fear "that black people will come out of theaters wanting to burn shit down." "Do the Right Thing seems more likely to provoke debate than

destruction. The movie isn't dangerous, though the festering racial hatred it depicts assuredly is. Lee's two previous films -- *She's Gotta Have It* and *School Daze* -- made some piercing stabs at social commentary. But neither prepared us for the purge of raw emotion that detonates this powder keg."

We see a young Spike Lee starring in this movie, along with screen legends Ruby Dee, Ossie Davis, Danny Aiello, and more. We could have a contest to see how many stars you recognize!

ARMCA members will bring drinks and heavy hors d'ouevres, and you are welcome to bring food as well as well, but the point is that you can come right from work, eat some tasty food, and enjoy a good movie and conversation with friends on a Friday night without stressing out.
