## May: A Month for Celebration

### ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION

Each year, members of our Congregation meet to vote on our annual budget and to vote on candidates for positions on the Board of Trustees and on the Nominating Committee as per our bylaws. In short, we need to approve an operating budget and to fill vacancies created by term limits. This year, our Annual Meeting will be held on:

### May 16, 2021 immediately following worship at 11:45 a.m. via Zoom.

(Link to the zoom meeting is the same as for Sunday service - we will continue after service with a short break).

As with last year, you will be able to participate either by telephone, smartphone, or computer through the Sunday service Zoom link and your participation is so very important. Please let us know if you need assistance in participating. All pertinent materials, including the agenda, the slate of candidates, the proposed budget, and the 2021 Annual Report will be sent with the meeting announcement and will also be screen shared at the meeting for your convenience. Votes will be taken by raised hand vote via zoom – observing yeas, nays, and abstentions. In the event of a close visual vote, we will do a name call vote to count and record. Members must be present to vote unless they have requested a paper ballot by May 5.

This meeting also serves as an opportunity to both update the Congregation on the work of the past year and to recognize those who worked on behalf of our greater good. We get a chance to show gratitude to those who have been doing the work of our church!

## Widening the Circle - Let's Walk this Journey Together

The shape of our knowledge becomes the shape of our *living*<sup>1</sup>

Earlier this year, in January and February we were privileged to hear from Christina Rivera and the Reverend Leslie Takahashi about their respective roles in influencing the need for the Widening the Circle of Concern study and their leadership in its



coming to fruition. Their presentations were not only reflections of their perspective of the necessity for dramatic change but also an invitation; an invitation to learn, to be aware, to grow into the Beloved Community that we envision.

This is unique journey as a spiritual community... a journey of reflection of discerning hard truths, acknowledging the concerns and pain of those among us who have experienced as well what has been expressed by others in the report. More important however, will be the actions and activities we will take to become the Beloved Community we envision.

We take this journey as individuals as well as members of a community. Start by reading the report. Open your hearts and minds:

"to understand the lamentations and learnings the assembled Black people, Indigenous people and people of color identified..." (The Report, p. vii).

Read with compassion...*The etymology of that word – com, meaning "with" or "together"and, "passion," derived from pati, which means "endure, undergo, experience.* (The Report, p. xix).

The Report asks, *"how will our "living tradition" keep up with the times?"* Start reading now:

- What will be your answer?
- What will be our answer?
