AUGUST 8 Dr. Melissa James

Dr. Melissa James, Congregational Life Field Staff in the Pacific Western Region, brings nearly 20 years of experience in faith-based ministry to the UUA. She earned her Masters of Arts from the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago (LSTC) with a focus on faith and justice. Melissa holds a Ph.D. in Ethics and Social Theory from the Graduate theological Union in Berkeley, CA. While working on her doctorate, she served at First Unitarian Universalist in Oakland, CA and got her first taste of the power and possibilities of religious education in a Unitarian Universalist context.



She went on to serve at the First Unitarian Universalist Church of San Diego as the Director of Family and Lifespan Ministry. In 2016, she was named as a Fahs Fellow through the Fahs Collaborative at Meadville Lombard Seminary focusing on helping congregations support Trans and non-binary children, youth, and their families. Having worked in campus ministry as well as continuing to teach at local universities in sociology, religion, philosophy, and gender studies, Melissa lifts up the work of young adults.

Melissa is an ordained Deacon in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA). When asked what she foresees bringing into her work as UUA Congregational Life staff from Lutheran tradition, she reflected on its deep history and theology of reformation. "We are constantly reforming as individuals and institutions as we are called deeper into loving our neighbor," Melissa said. "We do justice not because without us it would not happen, but because we are free, in love, to do so."

AUGUST 15 jo mosher

jo mosher (they / them / theirs) is the Director of Faith Formation at First Unitarian Church of San Jose and holds a Master of Arts in Social Change (M.A.S.C., 2018) from Starr King School for the Ministry.

jo is passionate about the future of Universalist syncretism, as well as Interfaith bridge building in

today's world. jo's Calling is the changing of hearts and minds to be more tolerant – through altruistic compassion for all the oppressed, through patient communication amid conflict, and through genuine connection-fostering across diverse identities. jo is a nonbinary, genderfluid, transmasculine, pansexual Person of Color who was adopted into a white fundamentalist Christian family, and who had their life turned upside down when they came out as a young adult and were disowned.

AUGUST 22 Rev. Pratima Dharm

Rev. Pratima Dharm was born and raised in Northern India in the 1970s. Her maternal grandfather is a recognized freedom fighter who walked alongside Mahatma Gandhi to struggle peacefully against British rule in Colonial India. Her father gave up his rights to his ancestral land to free hundreds of bonded laborers and indentured servants in the 1940s. The formative examples of justice for the oppressed set by her maternal grandfather and her father became the framework for her own spiritual journey.

She started a school for poor children at age nine, under the guidance of her school teacher, a Catholic nun. She also organized several humanitarian aid missions for the displaced tribals and Latur earthquake victims in India in the 1990s. She migrated to the United States in 2000 and felt called into ministry in 2003. She graduated from Ashland Theological Seminary in 2005 with a Master's in Theology and was ordained as a Unitarian Universalist Minister in 2016. She retired from the US Army in March 2015.
